Rusty Keeler is an artist / designer with a unique sensitivity to the sights, sounds and experiences of childhood. He has a deep belief in the beauty and importance of play in the development of children and his designs reflect his sincere desire to create a more beautiful world in which to grow and explore. Rusty works throughout the world creating play environments for children and lectures at colleges and conferences internationally. He is the author of the book Natural Playscapes.

Ken Finch - President & Founder of Green Hearts Institute, Nebraska, USA



Ken is the president and founder of green hearts institute for nature in childhood: A young non-profit conservation organization dedicated to restoring and strengthening the bonds between children and nature. Based in Omaha, Nebraska, USA, green hearts provides educational advocacy about the value of nature play, as well as providing training and consulting services nationwide helping families and organizations (including early childhood organisations) to bring children and nature back together.

Ken has spent 36 years in the environmental education profession, working primarily with early childhood and elementary-age students. He holds a master's degree in environmental education, and is a past national president of the association of nature center administrators. During his long career he has supervised three nature centers, overseen two nature-and-science-based preschools, and has served as a senior manager in two children's museums. Ken is a champion for combining the strengths of the early childhood and environmental education fields.

Recently, she served as the Director of Early Childhood Education at Schlitz Audubon Nature Center in Milwaukee, WI, overseeing the expansion and restructuring of the early childhood nature education department. Previously, she was the Director of Tamarack Nature Center White Bear Township, MN where she oversaw the development of a multi-year project designed to transform Tamarack from a traditional nature center with a cognitive approach to environmental education towards an interdisciplinary center that encourages visitors to discover the value of nature through art, play, exploration, and inquiry. She is also the creator and designer for Tamarack's natural play area, The Wild Place and My Nature Preschool.

Marcie is the founding chair of the Minnesota Early Childhood Environmental Education Consortium and editor of Natural Wonders: A Guide to Early Childhood for Environmental Educators. She has also published articles Environmental Education at the Early Childhood Level, Legacy, and Cooperative Learning magazines. Marcie has a BA in Biology, and MS in Environmental Education and is a state certified early childhood educator with an M. Ed in Early Childhood Education.

Tutor in flax weaving, a tikanga (protocols) Maori perspective at maraes, NZ

Kia ora, ko Mandy Sunlight taku ingoa. I am a pakeha with seven children whose whakapapa to Te Hikutu hapu, Hokianga. I have been weaving for over 25 years, and pass on my skills and knowledge through tutoring from a tikanga (protocols) Maori perspective at marae throughout Northland with support from kaumatua and kuia (elders).

I have been invited by the British Museum in July 2010 to tutor flax weaving and research taonga (treasures) Maori held in the archives over there. This is a practise base knowledge recovery process with the dissemination of process' and practises the research outcome. Recently I have been involved in the Mokopuna Ora Project weaving wahakura (safe sleeping baskets) for Maori babies at risk of SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome), the ongoing result of colonisation. I have a relaxed and easy teaching style.

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Annemarie Zwack,

Annemarie Zwack is a visual artist who works in a variety of media. She also works extensively in schools with a variety of age groups. Projects range from papermaking, bookmaking, drawing, sculpting with clay, mural painting, mosaics, to quilting.
